Statement on Fabric and Ornaments from the Annual Report

As Churchwardens we know all the different rooms in St. Luke's, but there's a group who may know them even better than we do. The group we refer to is the Building and Technology Group who as a team have dedicated their skills and experience to maintaining the building most of us come to once or twice a week. Some of them will be at St. Luke's two or three times a week dealing with all the issues we have with the building we call home. Except at St. Luke's everything is on a grander scale and takes longer. The Churchwardens are very thankful for the hard work of the building and technology group who keep the Church in good order throughout the year and by doing most of the work themselves save the church money and enable reserves to be built up for when major repairs are required.
